The dangers of lead poisoning are greater than you may be aware. If you own property that was built before 1978, have it tested for lead. Do not risk future financial liability by ignoring potential lead poisoning issues.




Addressing lead is urgent.

Children who ingest lead-based paint dust, paint chips, or lead-contaminated soil can suffer serious health problems. When lead-based paint starts to chip, it poses a serious health hazard to children in the home.

Who is eligible for the program?

- Rental property that has 4 units or less and was built before 1978.
- Property that is in Genesee, Livingston, Orleans, or Wyoming (GLOW) Counties.
- Tenants with children under the age of 6, or have a child visiting them at least 8 hours a week, or a pregnant female.
- Landlords renting to families within the income limits or have vacant units.*
- The property owner is current on tax and mortgage payments.

What is provided?

- Monetary and professional assistance for lead hazard control in 1-4 unit residential structures.
- Typical activities may include: windows, entry doors, porch repair or replacement, painting, bare soil treatment, and general repair.
- Owners are required to contribute 10% of the project cost.
- If necessary, we may relocate tenants while the work is being performed.



How the Program Works.

You fill out an application. After eligibility approval**, we schedule a risk assessment of your property where we identify lead hazards and how they can be addressed. We will work with certified contractors to fix the lead hazards. After the work is done, we test your home to make sure it meets safety standards.
