UMMC has successfully registered as an OOPP and received their first shipment of Naloxone. They can and will now be distributing to high risk patients through their ED.

The GOW Opioid Task Force Text for Naloxone line is going very well. They have received 50 requests from individuals from the tri-county area along with other areas in the region.

Reported overdoses have decreased in terms of Batavia FD, and Electronic syndromic surveillance. It's unclear if it's due to fewer overdoses or more successful reversals at home with naloxone and 911 not being called...

Fatal Overdoses:

GC has had three confirmed deaths and twelve pending review.

OC has had One confirmed death and three pending review.

The MultiStat instrument has been approved by Columbia, and ordered (8/1/2023). This will help us respond to fatal overdoses – quicker and more effectively; especially if there is an unusual spike or pattern. MC will help set up the process for overdoses that run through the ME Office. Labs will be run in the GC lab where the MultiStat will be housed. MC did not want to purchase and take on the task of the MultiStat - cost for equipment covered by the Healing Communities grant. Having this device will provide Real time toxicology reports. Reports will not be for public knowledge. But could help aid with police and fire response, etc.

Immunization:

Clinics continue to be very low. But an uptick is expect toward the end of the month... with the start of school approaching.

RSV – Vaccine is now approved for both infants and adults over 60.

MPOX is now an STI and reported as such.

VFA program is consolidating their PIN Numbers, so we will no longer have a PIN for college MMR and Migrant vaccine.

COVID-19 will be a monovalent again in the fall, and not for free. The Bivalent Vaccine will not be authorized for use once the FDA/ACIP approve the new formulation for the fall. We are currently deciding which vaccine to provide; Pfizer or Moderna and possibly some Novavax since CSV will be offering Moderna.

Covid Clinics in OC have been very slow. Aside from Job Corp Students receiving 6 one week and 7 another, we have only given 1 other vaccine since the start of June.

Communicable:

Reported Covid & Flu cases are low currently in both counties.

GC – has drafted a case report on our unusual botulism case from earlier this year, and will be shopping it around to journals for publication.

OC – we have had more Enterics than usual in the past two months; and an increase in Legionella with four cases in the past month.

Maternal Child Health:

GC – is a little slow this quarter. Receiving about one referral a week with no answers or call backs.

OC -- No LHCSA Cases. We have had some one time new mom/baby visits from Unity hospital referrals.

Lead:

GC – has five new elevations w/home visits conducted (since the last BOH meeting). Currently there are 27 open lead cases.

OC – has two new elevations (since the last BOH meeting). One family refused a visit, and one family we cannot get ahold of. No home visits have been conducted. Currently there are 22 open lead cases.

TB:

GC – has one latent TB case that just started their second month of Rifampin.

	Rabies:	
	We are currently in our busy season with Rabies calls for dog and cat bites	
	or encounters with wild life (usually	
	bats) on a regular basis including the weekends. Dispatch and providers	
	are doing a good job pushing calls	
	until the next business day in nonemergency cases. Reducing	
	routed calls to our on-call staff	
	phones. Instead we are fielding calls Monday mornings which is good.	
	We are currently treating 3 individuals	
	for an incident that occurred in OC.	
	OC: Most recently had their drive	
	through clinic on 6/28/23. This was rescheduled from 6/7/23 because of	
	poor air quality. We were able to	
	vaccinate 131 animals and received \$68.00 in donations. There was 101	
	dogs and 30 cats. This was our first	
	weekday clinic in many years. Our next clinic is scheduled for 8/26/2023.

	Staffing: GC now has an opening for an Environmentalist with the Bailey moving on to pursue another opportunity. We are currently interviewing to back fill that position. OC Senior Sanitarian is retiring 9/1/2023 will be her last day. She will come back as a part time employee to help with the septic program. We will be fielding candidates for her Job soon. Enforcement:

Financial Report	OC: In process of getting budget approved and State Aid for 2024 GC: Wrapping up Grants for 2023. Started working on the 2024 Budget.	
Corporate Compliance Report	GC has sent out the materials via email Please complete if you have not yet done so. Updated Documents will be send out via Email from OC as well.	
Children with Special Health Care Needs	We welcomed Andrea Szymanski on 7/10/2023 as the New OC Case manager to our El program. GC: currently has 121 children enrolled in the El Program and for the past school year we had 236 children in the Preschool Supportive Health Services Program. OC: currently has 110 children enrolled in the El Program and for the past school year we had 133 children in Preschool Supportive Health Services Program. Batavia City School District has been approved to have five Center-Based preschool special Education classrooms. They opened the class rooms in September of 2022. Children from both Genesee and Orleans Counties attend these classrooms. This has helped with students that have been on waitlists for programs as well as students being sent out of county for services. Provider shortage: Both counties are still dealing with the provider shortages With waitlists for El and Preschool services in both counties. There are several children that are receiving Tele-Therapy that would like in-person services. We have reached	

out to many providers to inquire about them doing services in both counties. Some say they are able to Tele-Therapy but not in-person services. Families are looking for in-person services as this is ideal for little ones.

GC:

El has 13 children on a waitlist for speech, 15 for OT, and 15 on the waitlist for special instruction.

OC:

El has 35 children on a waitlist for speech, 18 for OT, and 7 on the waitlist for special instruction.

OC: February 15, 2023 the EI program was reviewed by NYSDOH to ensure we were in compliance with regulations and guidance provided as the administrator of the local EI program. OC was founded on two points. One due to the provider and evaluation shortage and the second for verbiage that needed to be added to our ongoing service coordination checklist.

Transportation:

Contracts were awarded to Two vendors.

Beginning in September 2023 we will continue to do our in-county runs with WNY Bus, and GLOW ARC will begin doing our out of county runs. The hope is that this will help with the bus provider shortage that we experienced this past school year.

New Software:

The new EI software system called the EI Hub had not begun to be utilized by each county replacing the New York Early Intervention system. The Launch date has been pushed back many times. EI staff are being provided with online training for the new system.

Children & Youth with Special Health Care Needs:

For the current grant year which began on October 1, 2022, both Counties have contracting out the Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs grant. Each county received more money than years past for this grant and was told by the State that we need to make sure each county has one-half of a

full-time worker dedicated to the				
program. To meet this need we have				
contract the grant out to Independent				
Living Center of the Genesee Region.				
They now have a full time person				
working in the CYSHCN program.				
We have had 10 referrals in GC and				
one referral in OC. A workshop was				
held in each County facilitated by the				
Genesee/Orleans CYSHCN program				
for those families that have children				
with special needs transitioning out of				
high school and into adulthood.				

Director's Report

Staffing:

OC – still has a Nursing position open. We have been looking at adjusting the rates to be more competitive... Senior Sanitarian will be retiring on 9/1/2023, she will be working part time (in a position that was created for her) to help with the septic program. We will be fielding to fill the Full time position soon.

Site visit by U.S. Senator Charles Schumer presented a Press conference for New fentanyl Legislation - focus to hold Countries (China and Mexico) suppling the drug responsible. 84% of all Overdoses are Fentanyl related.

GC & OC -- We are currently in the 2024 Budget season. We will be going over the needs in next 3 to 4 months to get the 2024 budget set.

A bill has been passed for Public Health to be held at a different standard than it has been in the past with Home Health Aid guidelines.

The Infrastructure funding has been approved. It will be used for training opportunities, retentions etc.
